Biographical note

CROSS, K.G.W. (Kenneth Gustav Walter)

Professor Gus Cross was a respected academic of English whose areas of scholarship included John Marston, William Butler Yeats, James Joyce, and F. Scott Fitzgerald. Cross graduated from Trinity College, Dublin and lectured at Rhodes University and the University of Adelaide before becoming a senior lecturer at the University of Sydney. He left Sydney in 1964 to be appointed Chair of English at the University of Newcastle where he became the first Dean of the Faculty of Arts. Professor Cross died in 1967, aged 39.
