## **Biographical note**

Camilla Wedgwood (1901-1955) was a social anthropologist. She conducted fieldwork on the island of Manam, New Guinea where she studied the lives of the women and children. Dr Wedgwood lectured at the University of Sydney and was Principal of the Women's College between 1935 and 1944. After the war she taught at the School of Pacific Administration. In this position she was able to promote the education of girls and women on the islands of Oceania.
