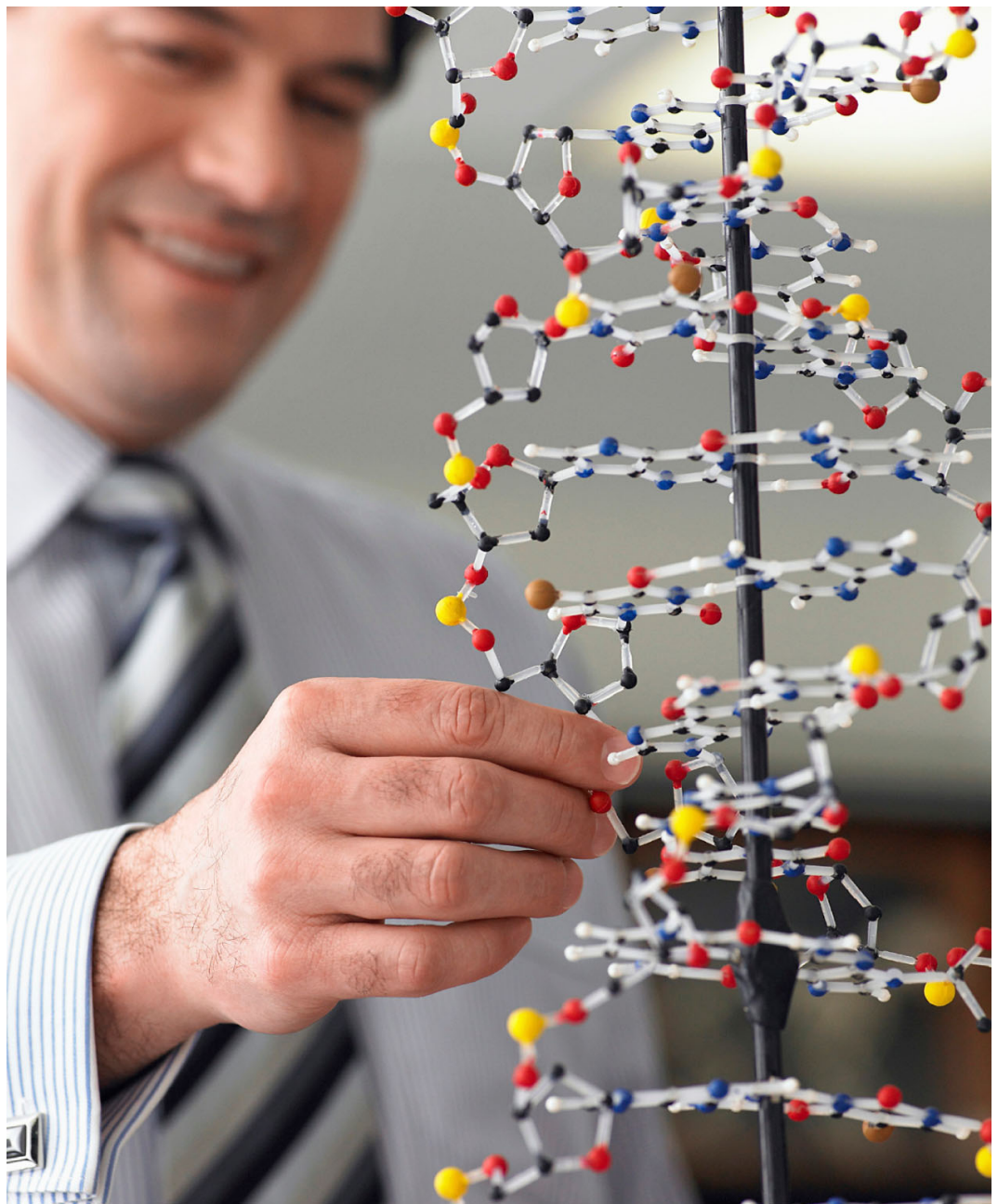

### Newly Added Electronic Resources

Electronic Resources	Description
<b>American Chemical Society: Guide to Scholarly Communication</b>	Provides students, researchers, educators, and librarians with the instruction and advice they need to master the art of scholarly communication.
<b>ASCO Journals Digital Library</b>	This journal examines the theory and practice of acquisition, definition, organization, management, and dissemination of digital information.
<b>Australian Standards</b>	Access increased from 3 users to 10 users
<b>Annual Reports Module (Connect4)</b>	The Connect 4 Annual Reports Collection contains the annual reports of all ASX listed companies dating back to 1995.
<b>Descriptions of Fungi and Bacteria (CABI)</b>	Designed for use by plant pathologists and veterinary and medical mycologists. They provide information for identification/confirmation of identity of species, along with related information on pathology or other economic significance.
<b>Earthquake Spectra (SAGE)</b>	This journal serves the purpose of improving the practice of earthquake hazards mitigation, preparedness, and recovery.
<b>eIFRS Professional Online Subscription (Electronic International Financial Reporting Standards)</b>	The eIFRS is the only source for authoritative, annotated versions of IFRS Standards, Interpretations, due process and thousands of other supporting documents.
<b>Foundation and Trends in Electric Energy Systems (FnT EES)</b>	A collections of survey/review journals in the field of electric energy.

<b>Foundations and Trends in Accounting</b>	The journal covers topics in the social sciences and accounting theory.
<b>JAZZ Music RIPM</b>	This collection contains, primary source music periodicals dating from the Early Romantic to the Modern Period. Collectively this archive offers both daily chronicle of musical activities extending over a period of more than 200 years (1760-1966)
<b>Max Planck Encyclopedia of International Procedural Law</b>	An analytical resource that feature peer-reviewed articles on every aspect of international law.
<b>Micromedex</b>	This is an online database about drug information, toxicology, diseases, acute care and alternative medicine.
<b>Reaxys</b>	Reaxys is a web-based tool for the retrieval of chemistry information and data from published literature, including journals and patents. The information includes chemical compounds, chemical reactions, chemical properties, related bibliographic data, substance data with synthesis planning information, as well as experimental procedures from selected journals and patents.
<b>Shakespeare's Words</b>	Explanation of Shakespeare's words from his published works.
<b>Early European Books Collection</b>	Accessed via ProQuest, Early European Books contains works by Aristotle, Copernicus, Descartes, Erasmus, Kepler, Luther and Spinoza, alongside ephemeral works such as pamphlets and almanacs.
<b>Global Issues Library (Alexander Street)</b>	Covering major topics, and events from the late 1890s to the present including border and migration, atrocities and human rights violations, peacekeeping, climate change, terrorism, revolutions, and human trafficking.
<b>Church Missionary Society Periodicals (Adam Matthew)</b>	<p><b>Module 1:</b> Global Missions and Contemporary Encounters, 1804-2009</p> <p><b>Module 2:</b> Medical Journals, Asian missions and the historical record, 1816-1986(Adam Matthew)</p> <p>This resource encompasses publications from the Church Missionary Society, the Church of England Zenana Missionary Society and the latterly integrated South American Missionary Society. Documenting missionary work from the nineteenth to the twenty-first century, the periodicals include news, journals and reports offering a unique perspective on global history and cultural encounters.</p>

<b>Popular Culture in Britain and America, 1950-1975 (Adam Matthew)</b>	Popular Culture explores the dynamic period of social, political and cultural change between 1950 and 1975. Includes colour images of manuscript and rare printed material as well as photographs, ephemera and memorabilia from this exciting period in our recent history.
<b>Migration to New Worlds: (Adam Matthew)</b>	Migration to New Worlds charts the emigration experience of millions across 200 years of turbulent history.
<b>Archives of Sexuality and Gender (Gale Primary Sources)</b>	Historical that examines topics such as patterns of fertility and sexual practice; prostitution, religion and sexuality; the medical and legal construction of sexualities and the rise of sexology.
<b>Indigenous People: North America (Gale Primary Sources)</b>	The collection database covers the history of American Indian tribes.
<b>Political Extremism and Radicalism in the Twentieth Century (Gale Primary Sources)</b>	Provides primary source material from both sides of Far-Right and Left Political Groups in the U.S., Europe, and Australia.
<b>Ralph J. Bunche Oral Histories Collection on the Civil Rights Movement (Gale Primary Sources)</b>	Contains resource for the study of the era of the civil rights movement in the United States. Included here are transcriptions of close to 700 interviews with those who made history in the struggles for voting rights, against discrimination in housing, for the desegregation of the schools, to expose racism in hiring, in defiance of police brutality, and to address poverty in the African American communities.
<b>US Declassified Documents Update (Gale Primary Sources)</b>	Contains facts and insights into connection with the political, economic, and social conditions of the United States and other countries. Materials from State Department political analyses, White House confidential file materials, National Security Council policy statements and CIA intelligence memoranda. This database provides a view of the inner workings of the US government and world events in the twentieth and twenty-first centuries.
<b>Crime, Punishment, and Popular Culture, 1790-1920 (Gale)</b>	Contains trial transcripts, police and forensic reports, detective novels, newspaper accounts, true crime literature, and related ephemera. The collection of materials supporting the study of nineteenth-century criminal history, law, literature, and justice.
<b>Making of the Modern World Part 3 (Gale)</b>	Providing coverage of World War I, The Great Depression, and World War II. This collection also covers agriculture, finance, colonization, commerce and manufacturing.

<p><b>State Papers Online: Eighteenth Century, 1714-1782, Part 4: Scandinavia, Eastern Europe and Turkey (Gale)</b></p>	<p>Contains letters, memorials and treaties pertaining to Denmark, Sweden, Poland and Saxony, Prussia, Russia, Turkey and the Barbary States. It also includes papers sent to the British Secretaries of State from foreign ministers in England, as well as 'confidential' and intercepted letters between key figures in international politics.</p>
<p><b>State Papers Online: The Stuart and Cumberland Papers from the Royal Archives, Windsor Castle (Gale)</b></p>	<p>The Stuart Papers contains the correspondence and personal documents of the exiled members of the Stuart dynasty after 1688.</p>
<p><b>Royal College of Physicians (Wiley)</b></p>	<p>20th-century reports on the effects of smoking, there is a wealth of material on the RCP's role in relation to contemporary medical advances.</p>
<p><b>The New York Academy of Science (Wiley)</b></p>	<p>The Academy has brought together people working at the frontiers of discovery. Among the oldest scientific organizations in the United States.</p>
<p><b>Royal Anthropological Institute (Wiley)</b></p>	<p>The study of humankind.</p>
<p><b>Royal Geographical Society (Wiley)</b></p>	<p>The Society's archive contains collections of documents, maps, photographs, expedition reports, manuscript materials and books, and span 500 years of geography, travel and exploration.</p>
<p><b>Art and architecture collection (ProQuest)</b></p>	<p>A comprehensive survey of current publications in the fields of visual and applied arts, the Art, Design &amp; Architecture Collection.</p>

<b>Global Plants (JSTOR)</b>	Global Plants is a database of digitized plant specimens and a locus for international botany research and collaboration.
<b>Sustainability (JSTOR)</b>	Contains journals, ebooks, and research reports in the field of sustainability. The subjects of resilience and sustainability are explored broadly, covering research on environmental stresses and their impact on society.
<b>ABA Law Library Collection (HeinOnline)</b>	It provides access to current volumes of included periodicals and covers all subject areas of American law.
<b>Religion Past and Present (Encyclopedia of Theology and Religion) via Brill</b>	Encompasses a vast range of subjects connected with religion.
<b>The Donmar Shakespeare Trilogy on Screen Collection</b>	This resource can be accessed via Drama Online.
<b>The Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC)</b>	The RSC Live Collection contains 17 films of live productions from 2013 to 2016-17 production of The Tempest, plus 8 films from 2018-19.
